This software supports :omilbo: You can use compatible amilbo™ accessories by touching them to the lower screen of your New Nintendo 3DS or New Nintendo 3DS XL system.

Using near-field communication (NFC), amiibo can connect to compatible software to open brandnew ways to interact with your favorite Nintendo games. For more information, please visit Nintendo's official website at www.nintendo.com/amiibo.

In order to create new game data on an amiibo that already has data saved on it from another game, you must first delete the existing game data. To delete your game data, open on the HOME Menu and then reset the data under amiibo Settings.

- Data stored on amiibo can be read by multiple compatible games.
- If the data on an amilbo is corrupted and can't be restored, open low on the HOME Menu and then reset the data under amilbo Settings.

Using amiibo with a Nintendo 3DS, Nintendo 3DS XL, or Nintendo 2DS system requires the Nintendo 3DS NFC Reader/ Writer accessory.

Just a light touch on the lower screen is enough for the system to detect your amiibo. Do not press the amiibo into the screen or forcefully drag it across the screen.

About Saving Game Data

When you reach the exploration pod within an area (page 7), your game data will automatically be saved to the file you've selected.

Data Management

You can manage your saved game files by going to the Select File screen.

Copying Data

Touch Copy, and then select the save file you want to copy. Next, select where you would like to copy the file to.

Deleting Data

Select Delete, and then choose the file you want to delete.

 Once data has been deleted, it cannot be recovered, so please be careful. Data can be lost due to user action, such as repeatedly powering off and on the system or removing a Game Card or SD Card while saving. Data loss may also be caused by poor connectivity due to dirt or dust in the system's ports. Please be aware that in these cases data cannot be restored.





2 Number of Pikmin Collected

The number next to the icon will appear gray when any of your Pikmin are missing or separated from Olimar. After a certain period of time, it will begin flashing red.

When the logicon begins flashing red...

Quickly try to find all of your Pikmin. After your Pikmin have been separated from Olimar for a certain period of time, they will start to disappear.

3 Collected Sparklium Seeds

Sparklium Seeds are a source of Sparklium. I are worth 1 Sparklium, while I are worth 5 Sparklium.

4 Collected Treasures

Here the treasures you've collected in the area will be displayed. Each treasure contains a great deal of Sparklium.

互 Pikmin Icon

Different icons will appear to represent the different types of Pikmin you've collected along the way. These icons will appear when there are two or more types of Pikmin in your party. Touching them will switch the type of Pikmin that you throw.

6 Jetpack Icon

Touch this icon to use your jetpack to fly for a certain period of time.

Whistle Icon

Touch this icon to blow your whistle and summon Pikmin to you.

Pause Menu

You can access the pause menu by pressing **START**. Here you can select a different area to explore or use amiibo figures to call for Pikmin (page 10).



Exploring the Planet

The mysterious creatures that inhabit this world are Pikmin. Team up with them to explore the planet.

Befriending Pikmin

The Pikmin will begin to follow you once Captain Olimar touches them. Blow the whistle to summon



Pikmin in the distance or reassemble your group of Pikmin.

The More the Merrier

You can complete more difficult tasks with your Pikmin, such as carrying heavier objects.

🖞 Where'd They Go?

Sometimes Pikmin will be eaten by indigenous creatures or fall down holes, and your team will decrease. You can try going back to bushes and blowing your whistle again to summon more Pikmin.

Collecting Sparklium

You can collect Sparklium by obtaining Sparklium Seeds or treasures.



Reaching the Exploration Pod

When you reach the exploration pod at the end of an area, your expedition is complete.



Retrying an Area

You'll have to retry an area in certain circumstances, such as the following:

- Olimar's Energy Gauge reaches zero.
- Olimar gets crushed by a rock.

Refilling the Energy Gauge

If you pick up a heart, it will refill the Energy Gauge. A small heart will fill one section of the



gauge, and a large heart will refill the whole gauge.

Use © or ⇔ to move around the area. You can also use these controls to climb small ledges.

You can move around using AB
 XY as well.

Using the Whistle

Touch 📦 to blow the whistle and call nearby Pikmin to you.

Throwing Pikmin

When the Pikmin are within Olimar's reach, touch the place you want him to throw them.

Flying with the Jetpack

Tap 🕚 to fly for a certain period of time.

 Pikmin will not follow you while you use the jetpack.

Viewing the Radar Map

Press \Box or \mathbb{R} .

 You can use the Radar Map once you obtain a certain amount of Sparklium.

Pikmin Abilities

Pikmin are naturally hard workers, and they'll be extremely helpful in all sorts of situations.

They can do the things listed below, and more!

Carrying Objects

The Pikmin you befriend will carry objects like Sparklium Seeds and treasures.



Fighting Indigenous Creatures

Throw Pikmin at indigenous creatures to attack them.



Different Colors, Different Powers

Pikmin will have different abilities based on their color. You can find out more information about specific types of Pikmin by visiting the Data Logs (page 4).



Pikmin Park

When you finish an exploration trip, you can bring back the Pikmin you gathered and have them look for Sparklium in the Park for you.

Exploring the Park

Touch a Pikmin icon and then the area you want them to explore. They might find some nice things



for you while they search!

Leveling up amiibo

Once you've collected a large group of Pikmin in the Park, tap to level up your Pikmin amiibo figures. (page 10)

The following amiibo can be used with this game and will increase gameplay options:

Pikmin, Olimar

Call for Pikmin

While you're exploring, you can summon more Pikmin from the pause menu. If you level up your amiibo at the Park (page 9), the number of Pikmin you can summon will increase.

 The Olimar amiibo figure cannot be leveled up.

How Often?

You can call extra Pikmin once per course. If you leave or retry the course, you'll be able to call Pikmin again.

amiibo Specific Secret Spots

You can unlock and play exclusive Secret Spots by visiting them and scanning amiibo (page 4).

Treasure amiibo

Your amiibo can appear as treasures in Secret Spots.

Scanning amiibo

To play Secret Spots or have amiibo appear as treasures, touch amiibo on the Area Select screen.

Other amiibo

The following are some of the other amiibo that can be used with Hey! PIKMIN. They can be used in Secret Spots, and they can appear as treasures.

- Super Mario series
- Splatoon series
- Animal Crossing series (amiibo figures only)
