# Shopping in the Silhouette Catalog

You can use Happy Points to purchase silhouette film from the



Silhouette Catalog on the Chibi-PC. Purchased film will be printed out and will then be ready to be taken on a photo shoot.

### Special Silhouette Film

Some silhouette film cannot be obtained from the Silhouette Catalog. See if you can figure out how to get it.

## 🕭 Photo Shoots

Select a silhouette film from your collection, and use it to



photograph a real-life object that matches its shape using the cameras on your Nintendo 3DS system. If your shot matches, a NostalJunk can be created! Press (1) to end a photo shoot and return to the Chibi-PC.

Make sure that there is plenty of space around you when taking pictures. If shooting outside, please be especially careful of vehicles and pedestrians, and watch your step.

### - Accuracy

You will receive a higher accuracy percentage when the object you photograph is better aligned with the silhouette. If your accuracy percentage is on the low side, you might end up making a NostalDud instead of a NostalJunk!

### 🔆 Maximum Shots Available

You can attempt a shot up to nine times.

 If you fail to achieve a sufficient accuracy percentage within nine shots, you won't get a NostalJunk and you'll lose that silhouette film too.

To change your commemorativephoto setting, go to Commemorative Photos, which can be found in Options on the main menu. When this setting is enabled, Telly will automatically take a commemorative photo whenever Chibi-Robo appears in the past.

 Commemorative photos will be saved to the SD Card. You can view them in the Nintendo 3DS Camera application on the HOME Menu.

### **Displaying NostalJunk**

Use the Exhibition Machine on the desk in Mr. Curator's office to display your NostalJunk.

# Receiving Notifications (SpotPass) \*
