If you happen to be lucky enough to visit the Louvre, you can take your Nintendo 3DS with you as an interactive guidebook.

4 Title Menu

Choose an option from the title menu.



- ◆ These are instructions for Home Mode. To switch to Museum Mode, tap  at the bottom right of the Touch Screen.

Look at Artworks

Choose an artwork you would like to view (page 6).

Visit the Louvre



Walk the museum hallways at your own pace, or follow a trail and view the museum's many important works (page 7).

Listen to All

Listen to the audio commentary for each artwork.

Slide Show


View a slide show of artwork, photographs, and images from the Louvre.

Tap  to update the guide, change mode, or view the tutorials once again. Tap  to view museum information.

Saving Data

User data such as your favorites list (page 6) and trails you have built (page 7) will be automatically saved at regular intervals.

Erasing Data

To delete user data, tap  on the title menu, and then select Reset User Data.

Once erased, data cannot be recovered, so please be careful.


- Data can be lost due to user action, such as repeatedly powering off and on the system or removing a Game Card or SD Card while saving. Data loss may also be caused by poor connectivity due to dirt or dust in the system's ports. Please be aware that in these cases data cannot be restored.



Select Look at Artworks on the title menu, and then choose an artwork to listen to its

corresponding audio commentary while looking at information about, and pictures of, the artwork. To search by artwork name, tap **Title**. The artworks will then be listed alphabetically.



Favorites List

Tap  to view artwork in your favorites list. You can listen to audio commentaries for your favorite artworks quickly by selecting them from the artwork menu.

Tap  to add an artwork to your favorites list. The icon will change to  when added.



Filter

Tap **Filter** to filter artworks using various criteria.



7 Experience the Louvre

Select Visit the Louvre on the title menu. You can use the map to freely explore the museum, build a trail around certain artworks you want to see, or choose to take one of the predefined trails.




Free Exploration

Use the museum map (page 8) to guide yourself freely around the Louvre.

Build a Trail

Choose some pieces you wish to view from the Louvre's selected artwork. The guide will create a route for you to visit these artworks and show you the time required to visit them.

Tap  on the title menu and select Reset User Data to erase all favorites information and trails you have built.



1 Floor plan

Displays the map of the floor you are currently on.

2 Touch-Screen display

The area displayed on the Touch Screen.

3 Menu

Here you can search for artworks, check information about how to use the museum map, and more.

4 Collections

Here you can view the collections available on your current floor.

5 Floor selector

Press **Y** or tap this option to open the floor selector, choose the floor you want to visit, and then confirm your selection by pressing **A**.

6 Zoom

Use the zoom function to have a better look at other things on the map.

7 Rotate map

Change the rotation of the map.

8 Icons

These are the icons that will be displayed on the map. Tap an icon once to display its corresponding information. Press **A** to interact.

Services

Notifications/Updates (SpotPass™)


This software supports the receipt of guide-update-related notifications and data via an Internet connection. If you activate the SpotPass feature, your system will automatically look for nearby wireless networks you can connect to in order to download notifications and data, even when you're not actively using the software (for example, when your system is in Sleep Mode). The SpotPass feature also sends Museum Mode usage information to Nintendo. This is for statistical purposes only; no personal data is collected.

- ◆ Data received through SpotPass is saved on SD Cards. As a result, it is recommended that you keep an SD Card inserted in your system at all times.
- ◆ Before you can use SpotPass, you must first accept the Nintendo 3DS Service User Agreement and set up an Internet connection.

Activating SpotPass

To activate SpotPass, tap  on the title menu and then follow the on-screen instructions to set SpotPass to ON.

Deactivating SpotPass

To deactivate SpotPass, tap  on the title menu and then follow the on-screen instructions to set SpotPass to OFF.
